


Community School Development for Empowerment and Gender Equality

Education is key to post-war recovery

- 17.08 years median age, 27% adult literacy rate, widespread poverty, broken families and trauma
- Education is essential to:
 - ✓ rebuild human, social, and financial capital
 - ✓ foster self-reliance, empower girls, and mitigate gender inequality
 - promote understanding, tolerance, and peaceful coexistence and thus reduce conflicts and harmful cultural practices
- Challenges: lack of government funding and qualified teachers, unsafe travel distances to schools, absence of electricity and internet connectivity







The Project

- 1) Infrastructure Development: two classrooms, a solar panel system to ensure year-round learning
- **2) Essential learning materials** like books, pens, and desks
- 3) Advocacy for girls' right to education: awareness campaigns to shift cultural norms and increase school enrollment





Give the students a hope

- Extended school hours during the wet season.
- Increased school attendance and retention among girls, boys, men, and women.
- Improved student learning outcomes and motivation
- Enhanced confidence and hope among female students.
- Improved life skills and employment readiness for adult learners.
